Blinds

Regular Cleaning

Dusting

Tilt slats first up, then down (but not entirely closed) to reach the entire top and bottom surfaces. Use an ordinary soft dusting cloth, soft brush, or a feather duster.

Vacuuming

Use the brush dust head attachment for your vacuum for a more thorough cleaning. Remember to tilt slats as described above.

Compressed air or hair dryer

Blow dust off of your blind or shade. If using a hair dryer, be sure to set it on the lowest heat setting possible.

Deep Cleaning

Aluminum Blinds

Use a damp cloth or sponge and mild detergent mixed with warm water, and make sure to protect your floor or windowsill from excess water. Tilt and wipe the slats of your blind clean. Many stores carry cleaner meant specifically for aluminum blinds.

Blinds can also be taken down and placed in a tub of mild soapy water. Soak for 5 minutes while gently moving the water with your fingers. Rinse it clean, then make sure the slats are closed before removing from water. Wipe it dry with paper towels before reinstalling then air dry.

Faux Wood Blinds

These can be cleaned with a damp sponge as described above, but may be too heavy to easily be taken down and immersed in water. Do not scrub or use solvents or any abrasive substance to avoid damaging slat coating.

Professional Cleaning

Ultrasonic cleaning every 3 to 5 years by professionals will get your blinds beautifully clean.
